The Pool

Please follow our pool guidelines, as these will ensure your enjoyment of the pool and future guests.

- Never leave children unattended in or near the pool.
- Shower before entering the pool.
- No food in or near the pool.
- Plastic beakers only on the lower level.
- No swimming after midnight
- No electrical equipment such as stereos near the pool
- STRICTLY No jumping from the terrace!!!

The Pool technician will ensure the pool is regularly cleaned. The pump runs for approximately 2 x 4 hours daily, but showering beforehand and ensuring no food or drink is taken into the pool will help keep it sparkling clean. When you swim in the pool without showering off suntan lotion, the pool will go cloudy. The lights in the pool are on automatic timer. In consideration for your neighbours please do not use the pool after midnight. Please note there is no exit via the back gate. The pool cleaning company come in using this gate.





It is NOT safe to jump from the terrace please do not do this. The banister was not designed as a springboard.

The pool filtration equipment is only to be operated by the maintenance team. If for any reason the Pool pump cupboard is left unlocked, please DO NOT FIDDLE with any of the settings / controls.

DANGER!!!!

Out of season the pool is covered:

- > Do not uncover the pool.
- ➤ Do not walk on the cover. It is not designed to for this!!!
- ➤ Do not enter the pool, special chemicals have been added to treat the water during the winter, these are not human friendly.

The Beach

Shortest route to the beach: La Mata Beach – reputedly the best beach on the Costa Blanca.

Go left out the front door, at the end of Calle Oviedo (next to number 17) use the black keys on your house keys to go through the 2 black gates leading down to a track to the beach. Using this route avoids the steep climb up Calle San Sebastian on your return. There is a boardwalk the length of the beach which takes you past many restaurants and bars. We like the kiosks right on the beach where you can sit and have a cold drink with your feet in the sand. In the summer season you can hire the sun beds by the half day and the pedaloes by the hour. When at the beach please be careful with your keys. If you lose your keys you will be charged for a replacement set and possibly also to have the locks changed.

Utilities

Electricity	There should be no problem with electricity supply to the house. A circuit breaker is fitted in the cupboard under the stairs should anything trip the electric supply. The breakers should all be in the up position. If you have problems please contact the Agent, there number is at the front of this book and on the post box outside. Power in Spain is restricted to 3KW per house. If you try and run too many appliances at once the power will trip.
Water	The upstairs hot water supply is electric and supplied by the water cylinder located in the kitchen. The downstairs en-suite shower is gas-heated and the agent will ensure the gas is on for your arrival.





Air Conditioning	Air conditioning is available in the two top bedrooms. Cooling the rooms is instant when turned on, We would appreciate it if the Air conditioning is not left on all day when not required. Thank-You.
Heating	If you are taking a winter break you will find the evenings get very chilli. The days are mostly beautiful sunshine around 20 deg but you will need heating in the evenings. There is gas central heating on both lower levels, and the air conditioning units in both top bedrooms can be turned to heat. There is also a mobile gas heater which is very effective.
Rubbish	Please dispose of rubbish regularly. There are large green wheelie bins on San Sebastian which are emptied daily.
Front Garden	We would very much appreciate anyone putting loads of water on the gardens as often as you can be bothered. Thank-You.





Security:

Although on holiday, we ask you to still to be conscious of security, if you are not you will be after you've been robbed!!

We have installed a safe and recommend you use it. While not intending to alarm you, pick pockets and thieves do prey on tourists both in the streets and in the home. We suggest you don't carry around passports (unless you are driving) or additional cash when not needed. It is also highly recommended to keep all security scroll bars / scissor gates locked at all times. It is very important to realise this is a large house and if everyone is on one level, thieves could come over the roof and down into the upper levels without being detected. Try to keep items such as cameras, mobile phones etc out of sight.

Our agent will also have given you the alarm security pin. It is in your interest to put the alarm on whenever you leave the house. However, please realise you cannot leave windows open and have the alarm activated as blowing curtains etc could and probably will set off the alarm.

NOTE: You will need to show your passport whenever using your visa cards. It is a good idea to have a photo copy of your driver's licence AND the hire car paperwork on you when out in the car.

Safe	You will have been instructed in the use of the safe on arrival. Any problems please contact the agent.
Keys	You will have received guest sets of keys. The same scroll bar key fits the lounge terrace and lower bedroom doors. There is an additional key for the scissor gate on the top floor. The black keys open the gates leading down to the beach path. You will also have the keys to the Studio bedroom/en-suite on the lower level. The agent holds the keys to the pump room and boiler / gas cupboard.
Alarm	Please remember the PIN given to you, and don't tamper with the controls.





Shopping

The house is situated in Calle Oviedo. (number 7). Out the front gate and to the right takes you up Calle San Sebastian to Citra. Del Torrejon. Turn right here where you will find all local amenities. Farmacia, small grocery shops, bars and many restaurants. There is a bank and further along are two internet cafes. Across the road is the bus stop where the bus (line A.) will take you in to Torrevieja. See bus timetable below. The bus stop at the shops will go to La Mata where it terminates, However, it is a very pleasant walk along the boardwalk/beach in to La Mata and not necessary to take the bus. You can also catch the bus to Torrevieja at the bottom of San Sebastian on the right. (opposite the supermarket)

If driving (Top of San Sebastian and turn left along the sea front) or going by bus, a trip into Torrevieja is very worthwhile. The shopping is great. The main shopping road is "Ramon Gallud" with lots of shoe shops and perfumeries. Parking can be a problem in high season, its best to follow the public car park signs, but buses are very good and cheap, running every 15-20 minutes – ask for the tourist info which is on the sea front with interesting shops, bars and restaurants. The Casino (not a gambling den, rather a gentlemen's club) is on the sea front behind this you will find a large air-conditioned indoor market selling excellent fish, meat and veg, but closed between 2 and 5pm – as are most shops.

Supermarkets

Mercadona: Supermarket. Out of urbanisation and turn right up Calle Sansebastian to the top. Go straight over and the supermarket is down the 2nd road on your right. The supermarket stocking everything you will need including alcohol. Open all day and into early evening. You need 50c or 1 euro coin to get a trolley.

Supervalu: about 700m walk. Down the Beach track, left along the beach and up Avda Del Agua, right into Citra Del Torrejon, then left into Avda. Torreblanca. This is a large supermarket, supplying everything including alcohol. Also stocks English bacon, Hovis bread, baked beans etc. Look down the back on the right in freezers. Open all day and into early evening. There is also an outdoor coffee/café bar here for a break during shopping.

Carrefores: Driving: N332 south following the Cartegena sign. You will see a large cinema on your right and a large new shopping complex. Extremely large European Hypermarket. Sells everything including TV's, clothing, food etc. Well worth a wonder around but very busy and shopping locally at SupaValu or Mercadona gives you more time to enjoy the sun / beach / pool.





Banks / Cash

The nearest Bank / Cash machine is the top of the road turn right and walk past all the Bars & Restaurants. On the end is a Deutsche Bank with a cash machine on the far side of it. As I recall you are not able to buy euros or cash travellers checks at the branch. |For this you need to go into Torrevieja.

Habaneras Shopping Centre in Torrevieja

A very good place for shopping in Torrevieja is the Habaneras shopping centre, it opened in March 2005 and has beautiful shops to suit everyone.

If you're a shopping 'widow', then take heart because the top level open-air bar/cafe area offers a great place to sit with a drink in your hand looking at the distant mountains while you wait!

Markets

Most street markets pack up around 2pm.

·Street markets are very popular in Torrevieja and the surrounding villages.

The street market is an alternative to traditional commerce and in them you can obtain numerous objects for decoration, textiles, clothing, interior design, craft, animals, footwear and

horticultural produce at very reasonable prices, which can sometimes be good buys.



The street markets have a real arab-style market atmosphere and have achieved great popularity amongst the Spanish and the thousands of Europeans that visit Torrevieja. Some are held once a week and others are permanent. They are often held on seaside promenades. Remember to haggle, to get the best price!! Unfortunate as is the case with such places as markets, quite often there are pick pockets so be very careful with your personal belongings.

Places to Visit

Torrevieja

Although Torrevieja is one of the most important tourist centres on the Mediterranean coast, it is not as commercialised as the Costa Blanca resorts to the north of Alicante, and it still retains a 'Spanish feel' and a relaxed environment.

The town is enveloped by two large and beautiful natural salt water lakes, which form the Salinas de Torrevieja and are an official Spanish nature reserve, attracting a wide range of healthy birdlife. Additionally, bathing in the salt lagoons here is becoming popular for many medicinal reasons.

The surroundings of Torrevieja are full of historic-artistic monuments, like the Casino, a modernistic building famous for its mozarabic style lounge. Other interesting structures and areas include: the Eras de la Sal, an ancient salt yard where the popular Habanera and polyphony festivals are celebrated; the Roman pier at La Mata; the Silleria Bridge in the Acequion; and the Archipriestal Church. Additionally, Museum of Salt and Sea is interesting.



Torrevieja is one of the fastest growing towns in Spain, and is best enjoyed along with the nearby beach resorts of La Mata and Guardamar. In these three areas, there are no high-rise skyscrapers or package holiday hotels. La Mata and Guardamar have some of the best beaches in Spain, and are just a few minutes from Torrevieja. You can also find good beaches at Los Locos and Los Naufragos along the coast of Torrevieja town.

The marina at Torrevieja is a relaxing place to stroll and have lunch. In the evenings, this area and the surrounding streets are a hive of activity,

with a plethora of busy cafes, restaurants and bars. There are also many shopping opportunities and an excellent indoor seafood market here. Every Friday morning one of the largest street markets in Spain can be found on Avenida de las Habeneras. Torrevieja is also famous for its many fiestas, with the largest being the Habaneras Festival, an international music contest, in August.

Torrevieja is ideally situated for daytrips around the area. Alicante is just 47kms away, while Cartagena is 55kms away. The charming city of Murcia is 46kms away. Farther afield, visit the metropolises of Barcelona (570kms) or Madrid (445kms).

Torrevieja is on the Costa Blanca, roughly halfway between Alicante and Murcia. The town is about 30 to 40 minutes by car from Alicante's El Altet Airport or Murcia Airport. Flights from London take about two and a half hours

Climate:

The climate in Torrevieja is very stable, belonging to the temperate Continental type, with predominantly mild temperatures in winter as in summer. The coldest months are January and February, with temperatures ranging from 12 to 16 degrees and the hottest months are July and August with temperatures ranging from 28 to 35 degrees.

The Autumn - from October to December - is the very mild season with temperatures ranging from 21 to 27 degrees.

Temperatures are measured in centigrade and this information is well publicised in the media and on lighted signs in public establishments.

Rainfall is scarce and intermittent.





Torrevieja has a micro-climate which marks it out from other neighbouring towns. The proximity of two salt lakes work in favour of good climatic conditions with regard to both torrential rainfall and strong winds. A sunny climate predominates for most of the year.

Culture:

Torrevieja offers to its visitors a wide range of music concert programmes, theatre performances, exhibitions, conferences, choral recitals, competitions of international prestige within its winter, spring, summer and autumn cultural programmes, which are promoted by the Municipal Institute for Culture "Joaquin Chapaprieta" in coordination with the Cultural Society of Torrevieja casino, the Torrevieja Musical Union, the four choral societies and the more than fifty cultural associations of the town.

Language:

The official language of Torrevieja is Castilian Spanish, although on some official signposts are also written in Valenciano which is the co-official language of the Valencian region.

If you speak English you will be able to make yourself understood easily since most of the population speak this language.

How to arrive:

By air: El Altet airport (Alicante) and San Javier airport (Murcia)

By land: national main road 332 Alicante-Cartagena, Levante motorway Madrid- Alicante, Mediterranean motorway Alicante-Murcia, A-37 motorway Alicante-Cartagena, regional main road CV-90, provincial road 3321

Nearest passenger terminals: Alicante Bus Station, Alicante RENFE train station, Elche bus station, Murcia bus station, Murcia RENFE train station, Madrid South bus station, Valencia central bus station, El Altet airport (Alicante), San Javier airport (Murcia), Alicante port, Denia port, Valencia port.

In addition to public transport services, a taxi service is very visible at airports. They are in official, clearly signposted taxi ranks, and therefore any vehicle outside these designated areas should be distrusted. The journey time by road from these passenger terminals ranges from 30 minutes to one hour.

Beaches:

Torrevieja has the following beaches:

La Mata, Los Locos, Cabo Cervera, El Cura, Los Náufragos, Ferris

They have good access and they are well signposted from the town.

They have fine, white sand and signs to indicate the services they provide such as showers, foot washers, children's play area, rescue service, lifeguards, security and special areas for relaxation.





Between each beach there are a number of coves where you can enjoy bathing and diving in a more peaceful environment. Torrevieja possesses some exceptional sea beds.

Tourism:

Tourism is the main economic activity of Torrevieja. Its good climatic conditions and extensive coastline, together with the friendly and welcoming character of its inhabitants have turned it into one of the main tourist destinations of Spain. Tourism in Torrevieja is mainly national and European.

For the last five years there has been a massive influx of people from the countries of former Eastern Europe such as Russia, Lithuania, the Chec Republic, Rumania, Uzbekistan or Latvia. Tourists come mainly from the United Kingdom, Ireland, Germany, the Scandinavian countries of Sweden, Norway, Denmark, Finland and Iceland, Belgium, Holland and Luxemburg, Austria, Italy, France and Switzerland.

There is no large representation of Japanese, Asiatic, American, Canadian or Australian tourists. The months with the greatest influx of tourists in Torrevieja are July and August in the summer and the Easter period in April.

In recent years there has been a notable increase in tourists from Spain and northern Europe at Christmas time.

Torrevieja offers one of the largest areas of second home tourist residences in Europe, with more than 70,000 second homes used for residence or renting. The most usual practice is to rent a bungalow or villa during one month or one week. Prices vary from 500 Euros during Easter to 4000 Euros in August, although these prices are very variable.

The street market is an alternative to traditional commerce and in them you can obtain numerous objects for decoration, textiles, clothing, interior design, craft, animals, footwear and horticultural produce at very reasonable prices, which can sometimes be good buys.

Some are held once a week and others are permanent. They are often held on seaside promenades. The most popular street markets are:

Handicapped:

In Torrevieja there are very few problems for handicapped people. Buildings and public transport alike are equipped for wheelchair access. Likewise public roads have pavement ramps. Newspapers:

In Torrevieja you can find a wide variety of newspapers and magazines containing local information and advertisements. The local magazine Vistaalegre is published weekly, in which local news is reported. There are also a number of advertising publications such as Torreguia, Guia-Torrevieja, Donde, Hello Torrevieja.





The last of these include a very useful town plan. There are also English and German newspapers such as The Costa Blanca News, CB Friday, Female Focus, Round Town News, The Guide, Costa Blanca Nachrichtung. Some of these are free and obtainable from kiosks and commercial businesses. Throughout the town you will find kiosks with a wide range of written publications and where you can also obtain English newspapers and international editions from your home country.

Taxes:

Taxes are included in the price of each product. When you pay for any product, any food or drink or any service, you pay tax at the same time. This is a small additional amount on the value of each product. This is called the Value Added Tax (IVA) and is incorporated into the price offered to the public. No company can demand additional payment for taxes, since the sale price must reflect the relevant IVA percentage. There are three types, 6%, 16% and 32%, depending on whether the product is of prime necessity or luxury.

Opening times range between 10 a.m. and 10 p.m. from Monday to Saturday, although a number of commercial establishments are open every day of the week.

There are two commercial centres - one in the town centre (plaza de Isabel II) and the other, which is a leisure complex called Ozone, is on the regional road CV 90. There are also all the main European food outlets with home delivery service.

Gastronomy:





Amongst Torrevieja's many attractions as a Mediterranean tourist centre, is its superb gastronomy, which nowadays combines traditional dishes with "new cuisine", and which can be found in most of the town's restaurants.

Fish forms the basis of traditional Torrevieja cooking, along with vegetables from the nearby irrigated regions of the Segura river "the market garden of Europe", and meats, especially pork, which is still made into delicious homemade sausages and cold meats in areas around the town. The most outstanding typical dish of Torrevieja is the "Caldero" (fish stew) which normally consists of tasty cuts of fish called names like: "the hen" (la gallina), "the cock" (el gallo), "soft roe" (lecha), "spider" (araña), "red mullet" (salmonetes) amongst others.

The juice from these fish, which are cooked in garlic, "ñora" and tomato, is used as a base for a delicious rice which is served alongside the stew. Other dishes which are considered indigenous to the area are the huge variety of fish and rice dishes such as "arroz a banda", octopus (de pulpo), tuna (de atún), and most outstandingly, rice with peas (pésoles) and fresh anchovy which is prepared with tender garlic and fresh artichokes.

There is also a marvellous range of Torreviejan appetisers, such as the "calamar de potera" and grilled cuttlefish (sepia a la plancha), "pulpo ensangochao", anchovies in vinegar (boquerones en vinagre) and onion blood

The star appetiser is dried octopus (pulpo seco), which is cooked over an open fire after drying in the sun for several days, and is served with oil and lemon (a must to try in the Bar El Pica) accompanied by a "paloma" (aniseed liqueur, preferably "Candela" or "Tenis", with water and ice).

Visit the Bahia, Miramar, Tamarindo restaurants, "Las Cañas" bar-restaurant and the popular terraces which serve fried dishes and grilled sardines in the area behind the Torrevieja casino.

Pubs:

Torrevieja offers a wide range of leisure activities and night entertainment. At the time for going out for a drink you can choose between a variety of premises with different musical atmospheres and styles.

In the Avenida de las Habaneras there are about a dozen "after-hour" establishments. These have an ultra-modern atmosphere and a closing time later than the rest - until 5 a.m. Torrevieja offers the

opportunity to end the night in one of its numerous discotheques. These can be found in the Avenida de las Cortes Valencianas, the Avenida de Delfina Viudes and the Ozone leisure complex. The town's discotheques specialise in different styles of music, from "tecno" to salsa. Closing times are at 5 a.m. in the winter and 6 a.m. in the summer.

You can also visit the games and leisure complex "Ozone". This is situated on the CV 90 road exit to Madrid. This centre is more than 10,000 square metres in area, it offers the opportunity to have supper in more than 25 restaurants, play bowls, enjoy the gaming Casino or view a newly released film at the 8 multi-screen cinema complex which benefits from the best sound and image technology in Europe.

The town has a full calendar of festivals for all tastes. In very general terms, these are the most important:

- JANUARY: New Years Day and Procession of the Three Kings.
- FEBRUARY: Carnival festivals and processions.
- MARCH: Hotel and Business Gastronomical Festival and Presentation of May Fair.
- APRIL: Easter processions.
- MAY: May fair. One of the most important Andalucian festivals on the Mediterranean.
- JUNE: San Juan bonfires.
- JULY: Seafarer's festivals of the Virgin of Carmen and the International Festival of Habaneras and Poliphonic singing.
- AUGUST: Festivals of San Emigdio and de Barrios in honour of tourists.
- SEPTEMBER: Festival of Vendimia in La Mata.,
- OCTOBER: El Pilar festival.
- NOVEMBER: All Saints and Halloween. Festival of Saint Cecilia, patron saint of music.
- DECEMBER: Festival of the patron saint of Torrevieja and Christmas.
























































Museums:

Tomas Valcárcel Museum of Easter

Calle Formentera. Opening hours: Monday to Saturday, mornings from 10.00 to 13.00 hrs and evenings from 16.00 to 19.00 hrs.

This was created in 1992 and is run by the central committee of the Holy Week brotherhoods. Inside we can see - throughout the year except during Holy Week itself - **all the heritage of the Passion processions**, with statues, thrones, standards with artisan embroidery, displays of sculptures, paintings and other objects.



It is named after one of Torrevieja's most-faceted artists, Tomás Valcárcel Deza, who donated to the museum the small-scale replica of the statue of Torrevieja's patron saint la Purisima Concepcion (Antonio Castillo Lastrucci, 1947). We can also see another replica of the patron saint that was for many years in Barcelona with the Brotherhood of Absent Torrevejenses (Hnos Blanco López, 1957).

Museum of Sea and Salt

At number 10 in the Calle Patricio Perez. Telephone 96-670-68-38. Opening hours: From Monday to Friday, mornings from 09.30 to 14.30 hrs and evenings from 17.00 to 21.00 hrs Saturdays from 10.00 to 13.00 hrs and 17.00 to 21.00 hrs. Sundays from 10.00 to 13.00 hrs. Closed Monday afternoon.



It was inaugurated in its present provisional headquarters in

February 1995 and exhibits a selection of objects that constitute a reflection of Torrevieja historic roots, such as a display of handicrafts made of salt, a collection of photographs of the time. model boats, archaeological material, articles for fishing and navigation and others. Recently there has been the outstanding exhibition of a magnificent model and diorama of the Torrevieja sailing ship "Pascual Flores", the last of Torrevieja ancient coastal shipping fleet that is now being restored at the Sal quay after being bought by Torrevieja town hall in the United Kingdom.

Ricardo Lafuente Museum

Sited on the upper floor of the Eras de la Sal building, along with the former Business Group of the Salinas of Torrevieja. Opening hours: Monday to Friday, mornings 10.15 to 13.15 hrs, evenings 16.30 to 19.30 hrs.

We can see many objects related to Torrevieja most prolific writer of Habaneras song, Ricardo Lafuente Aguado, who also often goes there. Recordings, photographs, paintings and general persorial souvenirs of Lafuente and the group he leads,



the 'Salinas de Torrevieja' Choir and Orchestra, can be seen in this small but packed museum that has the Torrevieja Habanera as the common denominator.

Sports:

Torrevieja offers a wide range of sporting facilities for practising almost all kinds of sports. There is a Sports Complex in the area called La Hoya. It comprises:





- A sports palace with three sports courts, Olympic swimming pool, gymnasium, physiotherapy clinic, library and sauna.
- Covered pavillion, with sports court for the practice of handball, basketball, roller-skate hockey, volleyball and 5-a-side football.
- Tennis courts.
- Open-air athletics circuit.
- Football pitches with grass and hard surface.
- Municipal "pelota" court
- Bowling and "petanca" surfaces

Real club de Golf Campoamor

The Real Club de Golf Campoamor opened in 1989 and designed by Carmelo Gracias Caselles. The 18 hole course is 6203 metres' long with a par of 72, it is covered in lush grass, and is surrounded by beautiful pine woods and orange trees and overlooks the coast from Torrevieja to La Manga del Mar Menor.

The facilities of the Real Club de Golf Campoamor include a new Club House situated at the highest point of the course. There is a cafeteria, bar and restaurant,



large and luxurious social lounges, terraces, changing rooms, shops, club room, storage room, offices, ample car parking, swimming pools, children's playground with babysitting, sport centre, and facilities for tennis, and horse riding.

La Finca

La Finca, opened in 2002 and was designed by José Gancedo. The course has 18 holes and a part of 72, and is situated at the foot of Mount Escotera, in the municipality of Algorfa, right in the heart of the Segura region.

La Finca is a golfing oasis placed in picturesque rural surroundings with fantastic views. Ideally located for those who want to play golf in the heart of the country, while at the same time being able to enjoy the area's best beaches, sailing clubs, & a host of other facilities at just a few minutes' drive.



Designed to host top tournaments, La Finca has the greatest variety of greens of any course on the Costa Blanca, ranging in size from very large to very small. As a bonus feature, the course has a reserve hole so that, in the event that one of the holes has to be closed off unexpectedly, players are still able to complete a full 18-hole round.



Several lakes with running water & reed beds along the course add beauty & difficulty to the game, making the course the home of a wide variety of migratory water birds, such as ducks & egrets. The interior of the course is home to olive & palm trees, creating a beautiful backdrop of vegetation with a distinctly Mediterranean flavour.

La Finca Golf is about 30 minutes drive from Alicante airport and about 30 minute drive from Murcia airport. Exit 743 off the A 37 Motorway.


Las Ramblas

Las Ramblas opened in 1991 and was designed by Jose Gancedo. The 18 hole course, has a par of 72, and is on mountainous ground which makes the course very interesting as the holes are designed so that in most cases you have to hit over the ravines. The majority of people who play this course really enjoy the challenging experience and want to play it again and again.

The Clubhouse facilities are smaller than any other courses, but the setting and friendly atmosphere are second to none. The outside terrace overlooks the 18th green.




Villa Martin

Villamartin Golf Club, built in 1972, and was designed by Paul Puttman. The 18 hole course is 6,132 metres long with a par of 72. The course has been cleverly adapted by the natural surroundings in which it is placed with some water obstacles at some of the holes. Its fairways are of Bermuda grass and greens of Penncross.

There are a few gentle slopes and hills on this course and it's located on a riverbed. The main difficulties here seem to be the natural hazards of the cliffs and the large greens thereby each hole is different.

The Clubhouse facilities are excellent and offer buggy hire, trolley hire, club hire, a pro shop, a golf school for those who are eager for instruction, a driving range, practice greens, bunker and chipping greens, changing rooms, tennis courts, a swimming pool, a restaurant and a bar, as well as a currency exchange facility and a social club.

Winter Sun

Ever considered coming to La Mata for a late season or WINTER break:

Only the very brave can swim late October – March, but the wonderful warm days provide a great break from the long bleak months of British Winter. The airfares are very cheap and off-season Villa prices are also a lot lower. With cosy central heating and the fire for evenings it's well worth considering. With La Mata being a very local/Spanish area there are still enough restaurants/bars open in the low season.

What about getting away from it all for Christmas and New Year!!!

The climate in Torrevieja is very stable, belonging to the temperate Continental type, with predominantly mild temperatures in winter as in summer. The coldest months are January and February, with temperatures ranging from 12 to 20 degrees – great months to walk the beach or play golf. The hottest months are July and August with temperatures ranging from 28 to 35 degrees.

The Autumn - from October to December - is the very mild season with temperatures ranging from 21 to 27 degrees

Temperatures are measured in centigrade and this information is well publicised in the media and on lighted signs in public establishments.

Rainfall is scarce and intermittent.

Torrevieja has a micro-climate which marks it out from other neighbouring towns. The proximity of two salt lakes work in favour of good climatic conditions with regard to both torrential rainfall and strong winds.

A sunny climate predominates for most of the year.






Day Temperature in °C

price per kilo metre which is shown on the small counter machines called taximeters, which means that you can see for yourself the price of each journey. Journeys within the town cannot exceed 30 Euros.
